My dear Friends

My letter to you this week has at its heart a simple but vitally important request: please pray for teachers - and, with them, for teaching assistants, school support staff and governors. Please pray for schools.

Some of us work in schools, or are close to someone who does. Some of us are school governors. Most of us have children, grandchildren, nephews, nieces and godchildren who go to school. Schools lie at the heart of our community. They really matter.

And yet, over the last couple of weeks, excellent school staff have come under intolerable pressure. have been subject to the most awful vilification in the press, as they try to understand how they can safely welcome children back to school. The attacks made on teachers are completely unwarranted and make me weep. I am a governor in two schools, my sister works in school, many of my best friends are teachers and every last one of them wants children back in school as soon as possible - as soon as it is safe to do so. Their hesitations, their concerns. are only in the best interests of the children in their care, only have the safety and welfare of children right at the heart - and so their newly imposed status as new public enemy number one is cruel and unjust.

This is not a political letter. I'm not in a position to second guess the government's advice to schools and

nor do I want to do so. No, this is not a political letter. It is, instead, a plea for kindness, for compassion, for understanding, for imagination, for the honouring of a group of people who give so much to our children, and to our children's children. I know that I am 'preaching' to the converted, but my particular request to *you* is to pray; to *pray* for kindness, compassion, understanding and imagination *towards* teachers and the honouring *of* teachers in our media, in our national life, in our communities.

I don't want to be in another Zoom meeting where teachers are tearful because of the bad press they have received. I don't want to read another Facebook post from a friend who is broken-hearted having dedicated her entire working life to teaching. Please - pray for kindness.

And please pray for our children, doing so brilliantly in extraordinary circumstances, that as adults we would find ways to ensure that they thrive in body, mind and spirit as they are educated at home, and as they return to school. Jesus put a high priority on children - made protecting them a sign of his kingdom. We do too.

My friends, please pray this week for schools, for school staff, for children. There are few greater priorities for us this week.
