Dear Friends

The phrase 'British Bulldog spirit', meaning unrelenting courage, had evolved during the 19th century, plucky Bulldogs soon became a regular fixture in World War I propaganda posters.

But perhaps the most symbolism came when Winston Churchill became Prime Minister.

His jowly face, broad body, and steadfast determination to overcome some powerful adversaries in World War II made him an almost living embodiment of the heroic pooch.

Churchill's great speeches often oozed a deep sense of determination. There is evidence of a speech that was written for Harrow that contains the words: never give in, never give in, never, never, never-in nothing, great or small, large or petty – never give in except to convictions of honour and good sense. Never yield to force; never yield to the apparently overwhelming might of the enemy.

It seems quite fitting to use that sentiment, not just because today is Remembrance day, but the latest battle in the war against Covid-19 we are again left a little with our backs to the walls, our lives, liberty, businesses, jobs and churches are once again having to adapt to tighter restrictions.

Yet, history is testament to great stories of those those who overcame the odds, those who dug deep and came through hard times.

One of our great strengths as the church is that we can look to God, we can come before God in prayer to lament, to cry out and carry one another.

The great strength therefore is that we are never alone, and that we have one another. Last week we celebrated All Saints and we thought about some of the groups of saints at work in our churches, we remembered that everyone who trusts in God is a saint and that saints bring the light of Christ into the darkness.

We have seen and heard stories of different things people have done to help others in these times, even little things that have gone a long way. So please let us once again, dig deep, pull together and carry one another through this latest battle as we remember to look to God for strength. We may be locked down but we are never out!!

Makaton Taster Session On Zoom

Our regular final song at our All-Age service is Peace To You, and we saw it accompanied by signing in Makaton by Alison Cross at our on-line service on August 2nd. (You can see it, and any other service you missed or might like to watch again at the St Helen's website www.sthelensashby.net under the Church Life tab.)

Makaton is a Language Programme that uses Signs together with Speech and Symbols, to enable people to communicate.

Alison has for many years taught within the Special Needs sector of Education, and is a Licensed Makaton Tutor. She runs various courses covering all levels of Makaton to all age groups including babies, teachers, children and parents etc. She is offering any of us who are interested in finding out about Makaton the opportunity of some short 'taster' sessions. These will gives a general introduction into what Makaton is and who uses it, with the opportunity to learn a few signs and symbols too. Participants will receive hand-outs covering the vocabulary they have learned and general information regarding further Makaton training and Makaton resources.
