#### **Dear Friends**

This week I bought my Christmas stamps and then had a lie-down in a darkened room to get over the cost! They are now sitting, together with my stack of cellophane-wrapped cards, in my sewing room awaiting my attention. It's not a task I relish. Rather, it's a hurdle I try to stagger over before the beginning of December when my working life cranks up another gear.

The way I eventually persuade myself to put pen to card and envelope is an innate sense of fair play: I love receiving Christmas cards and so I need to send them too to give others reciprocal pleasure (I trust!).

It strikes me that this year Christmas cards might take on a special significance; that this year they won't be ripped open, read swiftly, and placed carelessly in the rush of everything else that December usually brings us. No, I suspect that this year Christmas cards will be received with care, attention and appreciation as vital connections to a world, a network, a way of life, from which we have been separated by Covid-19. Particularly for those feeling especially isolated in this pandemic, these cards might come as desperately needed signs that they are not forgotten; that they are precious, remembered, cherished.

And so I wonder whether we can rebrand writing Christmas cards this year as an act of love and service, rather than a chore; whether we can add to our list people we might not always remember in this way, those people who particularly need to know they are loved this year.

And I hope we are making ourselves ready to receive Christmas greetings, too; not just those messages of love from family and friends and colleagues, but also, especially, the message of the angels that into our isolation, a child has been born, for us; that into our darkness, an inextinguishable light blazes; that when we are stripped of all human company then, Emmanuel - God is with us.

Go on! - buy those stamps, break open the cellophane on those cards, and write of your love for the other, of your connection with them, even though apart. And remember: nothing can separate you from God's love.
