It is a time when we prepare for the birth of our Saviour as a baby and look forward to his return to earth as a King. This year, we are marking Advent in several special ways:

Advent Carol Service on Advent Sunday 29th November, at 6.30pm Streamed live from home to our Flagstaff Family Facebook page, this is a beautiful service of readings and music, reflecting on light in the darkness: the light of creation, the light of Christ, the light of heaven's eternal city.

Advent Prayer for the Day, every morning from 30th November at 8.00am

Prayer for the Day in Advent will take on an especial theme, looking at the Jesse Tree, at Jesus' family tree; tracing his ancestors of faith from creation all the way up until his birth. Each character we look at will have their own symbol which you might like to create at home and hang on a tree. If all that sounds a bit too much like hard work, Jill will be creating an online Jesse Tree for us. Advent Compline, Wednesday nights in December at 9.00pm and every night from 17th-23rd December

Quiet, reflective services to end the day in the kindness of God's company.

I'll tell you more about our plans for Christmas later. For now, why not plan your New Year with us; diary some of these opportunities for worship and look for the dawning of Christ's coming.

Advent Course: Tuesday evenings in December

The Revd Rob Marsh, who is seconded to us, is offering to lead an Advent course for the Flagstaff Family called "Journeying through Advent with New Daylight" produced by BRF. It is designed for individual use and to also to have a weekly group meeting.

The course is described as 'Five weeks of Advent material for church groups and individuals, offering themed reflections by well-loved contributors from the *New Daylight* archive alongside specially written questions for group discussion.'
