# Notices for 3<sup>rd</sup> January, 2021

#### Dear Friends

I'm writing this just a few hours after the Health Secretary, Matt Hancock, announced that we would be going into Tier 4 restrictions from one minute past midnight tomorrow (Thursday) morning. Being placed in this Tier is a mark of how grave a situation we are in: the virus is in our community and the rate of infection is high. We will, I know, continue to do all we can to support one another and to protect the most vulnerable.

Part of protecting the most vulnerable must be to review how we are worshipping at this time and, in particular, whether we should continue with in-building services; something which is permitted in Tier 4 but which may not be advisable. With this in mind, I am meeting with the Standing Committee on Friday afternoon, by which time we may have received advice from the Diocese. In the meantime, I will also have discussions with Andrew Chapman, our Director of Music, and others who lead worship. I will be in touch again as soon as we have come to a prayerful mind about what our approach should be.

In this difficult point in the pandemic, I wanted to share with you one of my favourite Bible stories. Israel's army are fighting a battle with the Amalekites and Moses is on a hilltop

above the action, praying for the army as they fight. As was the custom then, Moses prays with his arms lifted up as if reaching out to God.

As the battle rages on, Moses gets tired and his arms drop down. Whenever his arms drop the Israelite army faces a setback in the battle. And so Moses' lieutenants, Aaron and Hur stand either side of Moses and each hold up one of his arms until Israel is victorious.

I love that story not because of its rather confusing portrayal of prayer but because of the wonderful picture of support, of standing together in times of difficulty, of us lending our strength to others when we feel

I want us to hold that picture before us for the next few weeks, to make this commitment to one another: that we will hold one another up and hold one another in prayer before God.

When I am strong, let me support you. When my strength fails me, please hold me up. And let us never forget that underneath each and every one of us are God's everlasting arms.
