Other options being somewhat restricted, I created a little writing room upstairs with a table looking out on a view I never normally see; over my hedge onto the unmade road leading down to Prior Park, and into a neighbour's garden. (I promise I have been doing more writing that snooping!)

It's amazing the difference a new outlook has given me. It has told me that I am here for a particular purpose, engaged on a particular task, and has kept my more routine preoccupations downstairs, in my study, out of arm's and mind's reach. I am hoping that being in London at the end of next week will also energise me with new vistas, new perspectives.

I know that some of us have been fortunate enough to get away for a few days, and others have a holiday planned. I hope that you will feel the benefits of a new view, a new daily walk. Even for those of you whose circumstances keep you confined to barracks, I hope that, like me, you can find a new corner to settle in, a new outlook to revive you in your weariness.

Being a person of faith is to have a new perspective; to see things, not just with world-weary eyes, but from the point of view of our life in Jesus Christ. Through the lens of our beliefs, the world is transformed: what has looked like loss, is revealed as gain; what appears as weakness is strength, and we can see that those we had thought last have actually crossed the finishing line first.

And as Christians, we're called to a new way of seeing in our interactions with others, too: to see them, not just as they look or behave or speak, but to see, like Jesus does, with imagination, for all the potential they have, and, with compassion, for all that they might be going through. Before we judge, we are to look from a new angle, adopt a new perspective.
