Dear Friends

I wanted to share with you what the next couple of weeks have in store for me, and to ask for your prayers at a time of real privilege and responsibility.

From Wednesday 16th-Saturday 19th June, I will be leading the preordination retreat for those being ordained priest in the Diocese of London, and on Saturday 19th June will also be preaching at two ordination services.

In preparation for this, I have set aside Monday to Friday this coming week (7th-11th) to prepare the five retreat addresses I will give and to begin thinking about the ordination service sermons.

To make space for this creative, reflective, prayerful process, I have kept next week's diary clear of all other commitments. This is vital if I

am to offer the ordinands something of depth as they prepare for this next step on their vocational journey. (I will, of course, still be available for emergencies.)

Please pray for me - that the Holy Spirit would guide me to offering thoughts that might be sustaining of these ordinands in their priestly ministry, and please pray for them as they prepare to get ordained.

You might wonder, in such a busy life as mine, why I have agreed to take on the leadership of this retreat (Actually, I was wondering that yesterday in slight panic!) The truth is that having the opportunity to think in a sustained, creative way is life-giving to me - as well, I pray, as life-giving to those to whom I speak - a way of stepping away from the minute-by-minute press of immediate tasks, and taking a longer, wider, richer view. As

Christians, as Christian leaders, we are called to this deep reflection, this rich spiritual engagement. The real wonder, the real concern, is not when we carve out time to do this, but when we *fail* to carve out time to do this.

What moment for deeper thinking, wider perspective-taking might you create? Might you be richer for it even if it means setting aside the insistent for a time? And, on your return from those places of reflection how might your approach to the insistent be transformed, how might you be renewed for it?
