21<sup>st</sup> July, 7.30pm Zoom Lecture – 'History, heritage and faith: Richard III the gift that keeps on giving' by the Very Revd David Monteith The Very Revd Dr David Monteith is

Dean of Leicester. He led the project and oversaw the reinterment of King Richard III in Leicester Cathedral in 2015. David has been Dean since 2013, previously having served as Canon Chancellor with responsibility for learning and public theology. Prior to serving in Leicester he was Team Rector and Area Dean in Wimbledon and Associate Vicar of St Martin in the Fields London. There he led the English speaking congregations, was chaplain to the Homeless and helped to develop the £37million to renew and redevelop St Martins. He now chairs the College of Deans for the Church of England. He grew up in Northern Ireland during the Troubles followed by studies in Durham and Nottingham.
