Dear Friends

Firstly, some news to catch you up on....

◆Further to my letter last week, we are still awaiting detailed guidance from the Church of England about how we should look to operate following the lifting of mandatory restrictions on 19th July. It's one of the things we'll be talking about at PCC and we will, I know, value your prayers as we take these next steps.

◆Last week I spent three days at a meeting where the diocese considered the three possible ministry models that had been developed for implementation under the 'Shaped by God Together' process. The meeting decided that a hybrid of Model A (Minster model) and Model B (Mission Areas) would be developed, and that this single model would then be commended to Diocesan Synod in October.

◆Also last week, the churchwardens and I interviewed candidates to succeed Jill Chapman as parish administrator. We are delighted to say that Carole Netttles has accepted the role. She will begin work in August, with an induction programme.

It continues to be a busy time - as you can see!

Secondly, I wanted to respond to something of a Twitter-storm that blew up last week. It started with a Church of England vicar who is championing the creation of 10,000 new

churches. Whatever we might think about that ambition, the storm blew up around one or two other things that he said. One was ill-judged language about clergy, and the other about the role of people in our congregations. There are to be 'no passengers', he said.

I profoundly disagree. There will be seasons where each of us needs to become a passenger for a time, to be carried along by others, to be cared for, nurtured, served, as if a guest on a luxury cruise liner. Yes, there will be seasons when we can't man the decks but when we just need to rest and receive. You need to know that this is absolutely fine: that in our church family there is space here for you just to be when that is what you need. At those times, let the rest of us carry you, cherish you, offer you what room vou need. There is for passengers here.
