Dear Friends

Among the athletes, coaches and officials at Tokyo 2020 (how used we are getting to time-travelling these days!) is a whole army of volunteers: those who signpost to venues and clean them down after events, who marshal the crowds watching the road races and who offer chaplaincy services. One of their number is my friend, Brian, a physiotherapist from my old parish in Doncaster, who many years ago trained as a drug-tester, and who has volunteered at successive Olympic Games. Brian isn't paid for his work - he just gets board and lodgings - and the opportunity every four (or five!) years to be part of the most spectacular world-wide sporting event.

As you know every bit as well as I do, our churches, too, rely on an army of volunteers. We have very few paid (or stipended) posts - everyone else, who makes our life together so rich, is a volunteer.

First of all - thank you! I know that what you offer to church you offer alongside busy working and family lives. I know that many of you make huge sacrifices of time to do what you do. I know, because you have told me, that sometimes what you offer goes unnoticed - and that is hard (even though you don't do it to be noticed, being appreciated is

important - I know). I know that you see your service as part of your worship of our Servant King. This is wonderful. Again: thank you!

Secondly, as we begin to open up further - pandemic permitting - we need to understand which of us feels able to serve again - as a reader, an intercessor, a sound operator, a welcomer, a steward, a cleaner, a flower arranger, a coffee maker, a children's worker (and so on). We understand that each of us will be ready to resume a fuller life at our own individual pace - that is absolutely fine. We understand that some who previously served so faithfully may need to take a step back for a time that is absolutely fine. We understand that others might feel ready to take up an area of service in the life of the church. That is wonderful!

- heritage activities (tours, events)
- gardeners to maintain the circular beds at the top of the churchyard

We'd love it if you could offer to serve on one or more of these teams. The more people who offer, the wider the responsibilities are shared!

Finally, if you need to rest a while please know that is fine. We will love you and look after you until you are ready to take a more active role again - if ever you are.
