Dear Friends

Since the beginning of the pandemic, I have written a weekly letter for this pew sheet as a way of sharing important updates, offering encouragement or challenge and generally staying in touch, especially important at those times when we haven't been able to see one another face to face. I reckon that means I've written you seventy or more letters. You may not realise it, but in many ways these letters have been love letters - letters written to those I love, and miss. Some of you have told me how much you have appreciated them. Thank you for reading them!

Now that life is picking up a bit of pace again, and now that we are seeing one another face-to-face more often whilst maintaining our commitment to live-streaming - I am going to make these letters an occasional, rather than a weekly, offering. So - I'll still write when there's particular news to share, or a particular reflection to offer, but won't send out 'Rector's ramblings' every seven days. If you've enjoyed my letters, perhaps you could think about taking on a bit of systematic letter writing yourself. I was given this idea by a colleague who sent 40 postcards in Lent, one for each day (except Sundays). His Lenten practice that year became an opportunity to bless others by reminding them that they were

remembered, valued, loved. Could I pass the love-letter baton on to you? Some of the most poignant letters ever written must surely be the letters that soldiers write before they go into a field of conflict. These are explicitly 'last letters' where they anticipate their own deaths, and write to their parents or to their partner, with one last message home. Inevitably, these are love letters too.

During the deployment of British troops in Afghanistan, 457 such letters were dispatched and read by 457 families mourning the loss of 457 women and men. Those letters represented love and loss that I can barely imagine. I wonder how many times they have been re-read over this last week, as the situation in Afghanistan has spiralled out of control again, and how much more searing the loss feels now? Watching the news on Afghanistan there might be one more love letter we are each compelled to write; a letter expressing our love for the terrified, vulnerable people of that country, our brothers and sisters, desperate to flee a violent regime. We can't get a letter to them, but we can get a letter to our MP, to our political leaders, urging compassion, refuge, hospitality. If you write one letter this week, could it be that?
