REVIEW OF COVID RESTRICTIONS IN CHURCH

Following a meeting after last Sunday's service and people being invited to send emails with their views on this, PCC discussed on Tuesday how we should respond to the changing national Covid legislation and recommendations. The Church of England is largely leaving it to individual parishes to make their own decisions.

The clear mood of the meeting was that we should make changes gradually, although both the people at the meeting and people who have contributed their thoughts show that there are a range of views within our congregation.

PCC felt it was appropriate to make changes gradually and concluded the following:

- Choir stalls to return to their original positions. Our choir are very keen to do this, as it makes it easier for them to sing together. The congregation will, however, miss being able to see their smiling faces. We anticipate doing this in the next 2-3 weeks.
- We then need to review how we use the remaining space at the front of the nave and how we set that up for livestreaming of services.
- We hope to re-introduce choir and ministers' processions at the beginning and end of the services.
- Live-streaming of services will continue as at present, with readings, sermon and intercessions being led from the front of church.
- We agreed to continue celebrating the Peace by waving and smiling, as at present.
- We will continue to set aside areas of church for people who prefer both to wear masks and to be socially distant from those who are not masked.

 We are postponing, at present, a return to using the alter in the chancel. We recognise that this will disappoint a number of people. This will be reviewed at our next PCC meeting when we have had time to review how we use the space in church after the choir stalls are restored to their usual positions.
 Our reasons for this are as follows:

- we need to consider where we can
 offer Communion to those who
 cannot manage the chancel steps
 our Lady Chapel cannot be used
 at present because our insurers
 are concerned about the safety of
 the light fitting.
- we need to consider how celebrating Communion at the alter in the chancel will fit with our live-streaming of services
- Celebrating Communion in both kinds

 most people appear to feel
 uncomfortable with the thought of
 returning at present to a shared cup.

 The possibility of intinction [dipping the wafer into the wine] will be discussed with our regular clergy.
- We reviewed advice on hand sanitising. The rationale for sanitising both before and after receiving Communion is because of risks of contaminating one's hands from the exterior of a mask while removing it and replacing it. There is, therefore, no need for those not wearing masks to repeatedly sanitise their hands at this point in the service, although people may prefer to do so.

We will continue to review these recommendations, which may need to change if there is another surge in Covid or if we have a service with an unusually large congregation. Please talk to the Wardens or any PCC member if you have any questions.

Christian Aid Week 2022: May 15th – 21st

Once again at St Helen's we are supporting Christian Aid and hope that people will be as generous as they have been in previous years. As before there will be two ways of donating. Firstly, we will be setting up an e-envelope for people to donate online and emailing the link to everyone on St Helen's mailing list. This has been very successful in previous years and as a church, we have raised considerable amounts.

We will also be organising the usual house to house collections as well and we are hoping that our collectors from previous years will be willing to help out again this year. However, it would be good if we had some new collectors especially from the new houses around Ashby. The task has become much easier in recent years because although it still involves delivering envelopes to each house in your 'patch', we now ask people who wish to donate to return the sealed envelope containing their donation to a specified point –usually your letterbox or the parish office! In this way we do not have to disturb those who do not wish to donate and those who do, can do so at their own convenience.
