VARIOUS DATES IN JULY Festival of Archaeology

Tuesday July 9th at 7.30pm in the Heritage Centre: Mathew Morris, lead archaeologist for the Leicester Cathedral investigation, comes to tell us what they found. Spoiler: some of it is older than the church!

Saturday July 13th at 2pm: guided tour of our wonderful historic church. We have Plantagenet and Tudor royalty, we were a centre of puritanism in the 17th century, and the church building has been changed several times.

Monday July 15th at 2pm: New for this year! Churchyard tour. Find out why the east end is higher than the west end, some of the interesting people buried there, why it was considered 'insanitary', and even evidence of body snatchers! In Ashby!
